# Ruth V. McGregor Family Protection Clinic



The Ruth V. McGregor Family Protection Clinic provides holistic legal services for indigent victims of intimate partner abuse and sex trafficking. The Clinic offers students an intensive education in trial advocacy, community organizing, and victim empowerment. Students have extensive hands-on experience with family, poverty, and human rights law.

## What students do:

- Through direct representation of clients, students evaluate and critique current laws, policies and services available to victims of intimate partner abuse and sex trafficking.
- Students think strategically about how to enhance justice in the system and will partake in project-based work such as exploring new legislation, community programs and victim services.
- Through the Clinic's human rights initiatives, students offer abuse victims re-entry and economic empowerment advocacy.

### **Time commitments:**

Students must complete 300 hours during the semester, including class time (approx. 20 hours per week).

### Course information:

- Evidence is a pre-requisite.
- Enrollment is limited to six to eight students.
- Students receive six units of graded credit.
