Criminal Practice Clinic



Student attorneys in the Criminal Practice Clinic prosecute both misdemeanor and felony cases in county and city courts within Maricopa County. Students are responsible for a full range of trial-related tasks. Initially students are assigned minor trials and as the semester progresses are assigned more difficult cases, eventually participating in at least

What students do:

Students are placed in various prosecuting agencies in Maricopa County including Maricopa County Attorney's Office, and City Prosecutor's offices in Phoenix, Tempe, Scottsdale, Mesa and Glendale and work under the supervision of experienced prosecutors.

Course information:

- Evidence is a pre-requisite.
- Students may not take Trial Advocacy or Evidence in Trial Advocacy at the same time
- Background checks are required at some agencies.
- Students must complete 300 hours during the semester, including class time. (approx. 20 hours per week).
- Enrollment is limited to six students.
- Students receive six units of graded credit.
- Second semester 2Ls and all 3Ls are eligible to apply.

Time commitments:

- Students must complete 300 hours during the semester, including class time (Approx. 20 hours per week) in four-hour blocks of time.
- Students requesting to be placed with the City of Phoenix Prosecutor's Office must work full days on Tuesday and Thursday, plus one additional half day.
